# REPORT ON STUDENTS' SATISFACTION SURVEY

#### Abstract

The Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) is conducted in SBMS College for the session 2022-2023 to monitor and analyse the students' perception on the exercise of teaching, learning and evaluation process for identification of areas for improvement and enhance the overall student experience. The questionnaire adheres to that of the questionnaire framed by NAAC under criterion-II of TeachingLearning and Evaluation, key indicator - 2.7.1. Here, twenty objective type questions and one input asking for students' suggestions are included. For this survey, students were randomly selected and were kept anonymous throughout the survey process. The survey covered students both male and female from Arts, Science, B.Voc and B.C.A stream based on random sampling who responded to the survey. Students were selected randomly from each class by the teachers and student satisfaction survey forms consisting 20 questions were handed over to each of them. The respond of the students was tabled and evaluated which has been analysed using standard graphical methods.

## Give three observation/suggestions to improve the overall teaching- learning experience in your institution

The Student Satisfaction Survey indicates that the most of the students express satisfaction with the current college system and facilities, particularly in the areas of teaching, learning and evaluation. Nevertheless, few students have provided constructive feedback aimed at enhancing the overall teaching and learning experience at SBMS College.

## Observations and Suggestions:

1. Enhancements in teaching are suggested
2. Increased utilization of ICT
3. Emphasis on experiential learning though more project work
4. Focus on skill development for employment
5. Promotion of internship and field visit opportunities
6. Provision of mentorship for career guidance.

## Key findings from the survey:

Most students are highly satisfied with the quality of teaching, facilities, services and overall functioning of the college, as revealed by the key findings from the Students' Satisfaction Survey 20222023.

1. A significant number of students ( $87 \%$ ) expressed contentment with the syllabus coverage during their classes.
2. Approximately $85 \%$ of students reported that the teachers were thoroughly prepared for their classes.
3. Around $78 \%$ of students indicated that the teachers demonstrated effective communication skills with the students.
4. Approximately $76 \%$ of students expressed satisfaction with that the teachers' approach to teaching and rating it as very good.
5.Students expressed satisfaction with the internal evaluation process, with around $77 \%$ affirming that it is consistently fair.
5. Around $74 \%$ of students mentioned that their performances in assignments were usually discussed with them.
6. Approximately $60 \%$ of students indicated that the institute occasionally takes an active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, and field visit opportunities.
7. About $59 \%$ of students expressed that the teaching and mentoring process in the institution moderately facilitates their cognitive, social and emotional growth.
8. Approximately $60 \%$ of students agreed that the institution offers multiple opportunities for learning and growth.
9. About $55 \%$ of students mentioned that the teachers usually inform them about expected competencies, course outcomes, and programme outcomes.
11.About $80 \%$ of students reported that the teachers usually follow up on assigned tasks with them.
10. Approximately $86 \%$ students indicated that the teachers consistently illustrate and explain the concepts through examples and applications.
11. A significant portion of the students (78\%) mentioned that the teachers usually identify their strengths and weaknesses and encouraging them to face the challenges and overcome the weaknesses.
14.Approximately $83 \%$ of teachers believed that they can identify students' weaknesses and contribute to helping them overcome these challenges
12. About $66 \%$ of students strongly agreed that the institution actively involves them in the monitoring, review, and continuous quality improvement of the teaching learning process.
16.Around $74 \%$ of students expressed that both the institute and teachers extensively employ student centric methods to enhance learning experiences.
13. An overwhelming $94 \%$ of students strongly agreed that teachers encourage them to participate in extracurricular activities.
14. About $74 \%$ of students moderately agreed that both the institute and teachers have made efforts to instil soft skills, life skills, and employability skills, preparing them for the professional world.
15. It has been identified that $54 \%$ of teachers utilize ICT tools in the classrooms during their teaching sessions.
16. Approximately $68 \%$ of students agreed that the overall quality of teaching and learning process in SBMS College is rated as very good.

The survey results reveal that most students are content with syllabus coverage, teachers' preparedness, communication skills, fairness of internal evaluation process and teacher's encouragement to students towards their participation in extracurricular activities.
